While most people packing away their cauldrons and witches brooms till next year, for thousands of Oxnard's youth preparing for their future, life is only getting scarier. Despite all the warnings, it still seems to sneak up on them, three letters... B-O-O! No, actually, it's much worse. Try S-A-Ts... or A-C-T. The truth is, planning the rest of your life at 16 years of age can be a bit terrifying.

Hoping to ease this tension is Cal-PAL, a support organization for PALs across the state. The organization's event, *Life After High School*,

seeks to create a true "college experience," allotting youth the opportunity to sleep in a college dormitory, eat at a cafeteria university and receive tips from actual students. college



addition, PAL youth receive information on other after-high school options, including Police and Fire, the military, junior college and trade school.

With only 37% of students earning their degrees within four years, readiness is key. For that reason, the event

focuses heavily on the importance of preparing financially and taking the appropriate high school classes. Even details regarding the differences between the UC and CSU systems are discussed.



A Closer Look: Kingsley Garrick

Kingsley Garrick is an ideal staff member. Once a PAL kid himself, he use to frequent the center he now supervises. Then, Youth Center Supervisor, Mike Ramirez, recalls the vibrant young high schooler.

"Kingsley and his friends came to the center just about every day. He was in to break dancing and the teen center floor was perfect for that. They would practice until the whole center reeked of sweat. {laughing} It's hard to forget."

Kingsley is an excellent example of the long-term

benefits PAL's youth services can provide.

"I understand where these kids are coming from and I remember all the little things that made a difference for me," said Kingsley. "I just try to make sure that they know I'm here for them and I never underestimate the small stuff."

In addition to supervising the PAL Youth Center, Kingsley coaches Flag Football and Basketball. He also coordinates PAL's "open mic" nights, Christmas plays and Chess Club.

"Those programs make a big difference. I remember when I

was younger the confidence it gave me—knowing how to play chess or performing in front of crowd," said Kingsley.

A student at Oxnard College, Kinglsey has just completed his EMT and Fire Tech 151 courses, receiving an "A" in both classes. Kingsley's longterm goal is to work as a paramedic, and eventually become a firefighter.

"Whatever guidance and support he received as a PAL youth, he's given back many times over. He's why we all do what we do."
